The Difference Between Trust and Faith in God – Patricia Olatunde

Faith is believing what God says. **Hebrews 11:1** - “Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.” Faith is conviction. It believes God’s word before any results appear.

Scripture teaches that faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Faith is built on revelation.

Trust is leaning on who God is. **Proverbs 3:5–6** - “Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding...” Trust is relational. It rests in God’s character, not only in His promises.

Psalms 9:10 - “Those who know Your name will put their trust in You.”

Faith believes for the miracle. Trust remains when the miracle is delayed.

Practically speaking: Faith says, “God will do this.” Trust says, “Even if He does not do it - or does it differently than I expect - I will still trust Him.” **Job 13:15** - “Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him.”

Faith is confidence in God’s word. Trust is surrender to God’s heart.

Faith moves mountains. Trust keeps you steady while you wait for them to move.

Both are necessary - but trust sustains what faith begins.

Do you only believe what God says, or do you also trust who He is?
